What Should People Do in Case of a Chemical Attack?

Indoors

- f Do whatever it takes to find clean air quickly; protect respiratory functions by covering nose and mouth.
- f Open or break a windowto access clean air.
- f Quickly exit the facility without passing through contaminated areas.
- f Evacuate to street or roof, if safe to do so.
- f Seek medical attention.
- f Call 9-1-1, follow directions from emergency personnel when they arrive on scene.

Outdoors

- f Avoid any obvious plume or vapor cloud; protect respiratory functions by covering nose and mouth.
- f Walk away from site and into a building to shelter-inplace.
- f Enter an indoor facility, immediately lock doors, close windows, and air vents to block external airflow as quickly as possible.
